Hudson Steele had logged just six starts over the course of his 3- and 4-year-old seasons, finishing second--via disqualification--in the Oliver S. at Indiana Downs ahead of a victory in the Jersey Derby. He faced the starter but twice in 2011, for a good-looking score over some stakes-tested rivals in a third-level allowance over the Gulfstream turf in April, and was shelved off a neck defeat at the hands of Straight Story (Giant's Causeway) in Belmont's GIII Fort Marcy S. the next month. Gone nine days short of a full year off that effort, Hudson Steele returned to action in this track's Henry S. Clark S. Apr. 28, rallying from third to score as the 2-1 favorite, with Humble and Hungry back in fourth in his seasonal debut. Tucked away in about fourth position as Straight Story doled out reasonable splits up front, Hudson Steele bided his time around the turn and waited for that pacesetter to come back to him. He did just that entering the stretch, and Javier Castellano took full advantage, collaring him at the three-sixteenths pole before going on to a clear-cut victory. Humble and Hungry followed the move of the eventual winner while saving ground for most of the opening seven furlongs and stayed on well into second.
